In addition, tile is much more durable than shingles, and the lifespan on a tile roof doubles if not triples that of a shingle one. Tile roofing also affords much more protection against hurricane-force winds. When compared to shingles, the apparent downside is the cost factor; a tile roof replacement in Hollywood, FL, can range between \$25-50k or more depending on the size of the home and the rarity of the tiles used. Tile also comes in various styles and colors, allowing creativity to flourish. Last but not least, there is metal roofing. The trend in recent years has seen a sharp increase in homeowners opting to get a metal roof replacement in Hollywood, FL.
