First of all, you can expect your dog to get a high-quality wash and dry. The dog grooming service will also de-shed your dog and trim away any excess fur that may be in its face or paws. This is useful if your dog's breed produces too much fur for the area's climate.

Your dog groomer will also be equipped to deal with ticks and fleas. They'll notify you of any other problems that they can't treat.

Finally, your dog will get a nail trim. This is especially useful if your dog is sensitive to people touching their feet and lashes out when you try to do it at home.

How Often Should You Groom Your Dog?

Grooming your dog should be done regularly. However, different breeds require it in varying frequencies.

Short-haired dogs don't need as much grooming as long-haired ones. It's much easier for their owners to clean their fur, and they won't require as many trims. You can go up to a few months before they need a thorough bath.

Meanwhile, long-haired dogs need constant grooming. It's best to brush out any tangles daily and give them a bath once a month. They may need a haircut every eight to twelve weeks, as well.

Where to Find a Dog Grooming Service

If you're not sure where to find a dog groomer, you can always see if they offer grooming at your local vet. Keep in mind that a vet service is more focused on the overall health of your dog, rather than appearances. Don't expect a fancy cut from them.
